Donations - Leith and Stirling County RFC

We have made 2 donations to worthy clubs since the publication of our last Newsletter.

Leith Rugby Club is a small club which has operated in the heart of the Leith community since it was founded as Leith Academicals Rugby Football Club in 1921.

Leith itself has areas of material social deprivation and compares unfavourably with Edinburgh as a whole and extra-curricular sport provision has dwindled to virtually nothing, meaning that there is no great rugby tradition in the Leith area.

Leith Rugby Youth Development (LRYD) aims to change this situation.

Stirling County RFC have received donations from us for the past 2 years and it is proving to be well founded.

Their most significant growth has come in girls' rugby: from 12 girls in total just over two seasons ago, they now have 34 U18s and 28 U15s at the club and a recently started U12s section already has 12 at training. Mini to male Youth rugby has seen a 10% growth in players in the past 18 months. Wallace High school has gone from 3 teams to 4 teams in the boys with a full squad now at U15 girls where previously they had to join with other schools to make up a team.

Report on visit to Duns Rugby Club

Further to our donation to Duns Rugby Club (see www.f-s-r.org "Successes" tab for more info), we were invited to join them for the celebrations.

On Saturday 26th August Duns RFC had a "Grand Opening Family Fun Day", to celebrate the opening of their new clubhouse facilities. Over 200 members and guests sat down to lunch, after which Rob Flockhart, President of the SRU, declared the new facilities open.

The new facilities are situated in the grounds of the Old Berwickshire High School, and consist of a large function area and bar, kitchen, community room, changing rooms, treatment room and rooms for officials. Rob Flockhart described the facilities at Duns as the model for how rugby clubs can thrive in their community, by opening their doors to all in the community.

Duns RFC had benefited from financial assistance from the SRU (£50K), Sports Scotland (£56k) as well as money raised by selling their old premises in the centre of the town, and assistance from Friends of Scottish Rugby, and many others. Much of the work on the new building had been carried out by club volunteers, over a period of five years.

Also on the same site as the rugby club are the local primary and secondary schools, the local swimming pool, the football club and the squash club.

The Club President described the vision that the club had five years ago, to produce a high quality facility, that they now have. This year they expect to be running two senior teams, as well as Youth, U16, Colts and mini rugby.

Following lunch, and in warm bright sunshine, the Duns 1st XV played an invitation Kelso 2nd XV and won 36-12. The future is looking good for Duns.
